Matters arising There were no matters arising from the Minutes

<u>Reports</u> <u>County Councillor</u> There was no report from Cllr.Tindall

Local Joint Committee The Parish Council had not been formally notified about arrangements for the new Bridgnorth LJC, to which the Brown Clee parishes had been added. Neither the clerk the Chairman nor the existing representative had been invited although a general statement about a meeting to discuss youth projects in Bridgnorth had been received.

<u>Village Hall</u> The kitchen now complete. The first showing of Flicks in the Sticks had been held and was enthusiastically received by an audience of 37. The clerk explained that over the next few weeks, the CIL money due to the parish would be paid into the account. It was hoped that two projects would then be able to go ahead i.e. refurbishment of the gents' toilets and installation of a WiFi link. Councillors were asked if they would be willing to establish a special 'Village Hall Fabric Fund' on the Parish Council account. The clerk explained that any grants, donations etc. could be paid into the account and when invoices for VH improvements were paid, any VAT due could be recovered. <u>IT WAS RESOLVED</u> on a proposal by Mrs.Pearce and seconded by Mr.Dunn, that such an account should be opened.

Highways A recent accident near to 'Treeside' on B4364 was referred to. It was hoped that work would be undertaken during the summer to prevent the water flowing onto the highway which caused the icy surface. Several other road defects and the general poor condition of local roads were noted.
